3RD ANNUAL CAKE RACE - SEPTEMBER 15

Men and women of all ages and from all communities are invited to participate in this year's cake race, which will take place in Springfield at the public library on Sunday, September 15, at 5 p.m. sharp. The race distance this year is 2.4 miles - once around the regular jogger's loop - for all participants, men and women. This is a change from last year when the men ran two loops or 4.8 miles. Homemade cakes will be awarded to the first five finishers in each of these age groups:

Women: 11-and-under; 12-to-17; 18-to-29; 30-and-over

Men: 10-and-under; 11-to-14; 15-to-25; 26-to-39; 40-to-49; 50-and-over

Colorful ribbons will be given to all finishers. Record times for these age groups are listed on the next page. Fifty cakes are needed, so anyone who wishes to donate one, please contact Byron Mundy. Last year there were 97 runners, and the previous year there were 71. Approximately 120 runners are expected for this year's race.

FALL SCHEDULE BEGINS SEPTEMBER 15

The fall schedule for group runs in Springfield and Collingdale begins the week of September 15 with the Cake Race. In Springfield, the joggers will meet Wednesdays (9/18) at 4:30 p.m. at the library; Thursdays (9/19) at 6:30 p.m. at the high school track; and Sundays (9/22) at 4 p.m. at the library. This three-days-a-week schedule will continue through the winter and spring months. The Tuesday and Thursday evening runs will end September 12.

In Collingdale, the last Wednesday evening run will be on September 11. Runs will be held Tuesdays at 5 p.m. beginning 9/17. The Saturday 9 a.m. sessions continue all year round.

PARTICIPATION CONTINUES TO INCREASE

Total attendance at Collingdale from January 1 through August 24 is 1564, with the following average turnouts each month: June - 23 per session; July - 31; and August - a whopping 44 with 2 sessions to go. Participation by women has increased tremendously to nearly 40% over the past three months. The largest single turnout so far was on Wednesday, August 14, when 65 people ran, with 19 newcomers included in the group. The club will be one year old September 21.

In Springfield, total attendance as of August 22 was 3842, with the following average turnouts per session: June - 42; July - 62; and August - 53 with 2 sessions to go. The attendance figure at this time last year was 2460 people, nearly 1400 less than this year. Total attendance for the entire 1973 year was 4242. This year's total will probably exceed 6000.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Both the Collingdale and Springfield Clubs are supported by voluntary individual contributions, which come mostly from the adults who participate in the group runs. No dues are charged. Persons who give \$5 or more are recognized in this quarterly newsletter. Major items of expense are 40-time plaques (\$5.30 each), T-shirts (\$2.25 each), 10-time patches (80¢ each), and ribbons (15¢ each). The printing and postage of the newsletter is another cost.

Springfield Club expenditures from January 1, 1974, to May 23, 1974, totalled \$521, as itemized in the last newsletter. Expenditures since May 23 have been:

- \$25 - Newsletter #6, printing and postage, 200 pieces
- 124 - 50 patches, 9 plaques, 16 T-shirts
- 30 - 24 gallons of E.R.G. drink for 24-hour relay*
- 15 - 3 Runner's World subscriptions earned by 80-time members
- \$194 - TOTAL

*The cost of E.R.G. was covered by 22 relay participants who paid \$3 each, totalling \$66. However, a \$50 medical insurance premium has yet to be paid.

Contributions since May 23 have been: \$5 each by Joe Wilkes, Hal Heckman, John Greenstine, Jim Thacker, Frank Dugan, Dave Netting, Dave Knight, and Paul Wick; \$10 each by Lewis Riess, Kathy Hoath, and Tom Stewart. Larry and Anna DiBello gave \$20, and Bob and Paul Koerner generously donated another \$50. These and the 24-hour relay income of \$66 add up to \$201 for the period.

COLLINGDALE-SPRINGFIELD CHALLENGE RACE

The Collingdale Joggers Club has grown tremendously in its first year, much faster than the 2½-year-old Springfield Club did in its first year, and even though Springfield has an advantage at present, it seems fitting that the two clubs should establish an annual challenge race. Such a race would not only test relative club strength, but would add a new dimension of "team spirit" to each group.

The event will most likely be a mob match, a sort of cross-country meet in which each and every participant scores points for his team according to his place of finish in the race (2 to 3 miles). For instance, the runner in 10th place scores 10 points, 57th place scores 57, etc., with the lowest total points winning the match. Final score might be something like 2523 to 2924. More explicit rules will be given later.

Those of us who run with both clubs would have the choice of which of the two clubs to represent.

A large cup-trophy would be passed from year to year to the winning club. The first mob match will be held sometime in March, 1974, so there's plenty of time to build up the rivalry.

24-HOUR RELAY RESULTS

As reported in the August 22 issue of the Springfield Press, 3 teams (8 runners each) completed the 24-hour relay held August 17-18 at the high school. Steve Whitmore, 19, of Aston averaged 5:39 per mile for 30 miles while leading his team to a record 233 miles. Art Dell's team, "Guys and Dolls" (which included two women, Maridel Walsh and Kathy Wilson), covered 181 miles. The "Over the Hill Gang" did 188 miles. The steadiest two runners were Joe Frattari, 15, and Frank Dugan, 51. Joe's first 20 miles were all between 5:40 and 5:52, while Frank's first 23 miles were between 7:18 and 7:38.

Many auxiliary activities took place at the relay, with the top 4 being: 1st place - watching Art's television; 2nd - pitching horseshoes; 3rd - tie between playing password and reading Byron's joke book.

The twelve of us who had run in last year's relay seemed to agree that starting in the morning at 10 a.m. was much better. And, of course, the cool afternoon was a blessing.

YOUR NAME IN THE PAPER

The Springfield Press and the Suburban Weekly newspapers continue to provide excellent coverage of the Springfield and Collingdale joggers club activities respectively. Both papers are published every Thursday and have a jogger's column that contains the previous week's attendance figures, names of people who set personal records (PR) on the long course. A personal record is set when an individual runs faster than he or she has done before.

The Suburban Weekly is published in Darby, and is mailed to Collingdale, Darby, Colwyn, Folcroft, Sharon Hill, and Yeadon. The subscription rate is only \$2 per year.
